



Entry Level Underground Miner Program (Red Hat)

Effective March 2025

Description:

Pierpont's 80-hour Entry Level Underground Miner course is designed to prepare students for the WV Office of Miners Health and Safety certification exam. This is required for a career as an entry-level underground coal miner. Trainees will be exposed to a general orientation in mining, mining health and safety, mine gases and ventilation, roof and ribs, haulage, emergency response, accident prevention and hazard recognition, and miner and operator rights and responsibilities. Students cannot miss a class or be late.

An MSHA 5023 form will be issued to each student who successfully passes the course. The MSHA 5023 form is necessary to sit for the WV Office of Miner's Health and Safety exam. This exam is given in Morgantown following the successful completion of this course. Students are strongly encouraged to take this exam as soon as practicable following receipt of their MSHA 2023 form. The cost of the exam is \$10.00 payable to the WV Office of Miner's Health and Safety in person prior to the exam and is not included in the cost of tuition.

Upon successful completion of the Entry Level Underground Miner Program (Red Hat), students will:

- Receive a 5023 form and Certificate of Completion
- The 5023 form is necessary to sit for the exam.
- The exam is given in Morgantown following the class.
- The cost of the exam is \$10.00 payable to the WV Office of Miner's Health and Safety in person prior to the exam and is not included in the cost of tuition.

Tuition

\$500.00 per student. Payment is required at least 2 weeks prior to the start date of the course.
