Mental Health First Aid

Description

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is an early intervention public education program focusing on:

- Recognition of signs and symptoms of potential mental health challenges.
- Nonjudgemental listening and assurance skills,
- Appropriate professional referral.

The course is designed teach how to approach, assess, and assist individuals who may be experiencing initial stages of a mental health challenge or mental health crisis. This program is recommended for clinical and wellness practitioners, Human Resource managers and other first line managers, first responders and others in public facing occupations and is open to all caring individuals who may benefit from having these valuable skills.

<u>Upon successful completion of the Mental Health First Aid Course, students will have the following knowledge and skills:</u>

- Explain the five steps of the Mental Health First Aid Action Plan (ALGEE).
- Recognize the signs and symptoms of mental health challenges that may impact adults.
- Apply the appropriate steps of the MHFA Action Plan (ALGEE) when a person shows early signs of a mental health challenge.
- Apply the appropriate steps of the MHFA Action Plan (ALGEE) when a person shows worsening signs of a mental health challenge.
- Choose appropriate methods for self-care following the application of Mental Health First Aid in a crisis or non-crisis situation.
